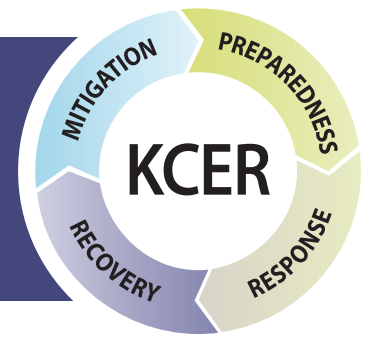


Dialysis During Disasters: What Disaster Response Stakeholders Need to Know
